NAMPA — The Musettes will sing and dance their way through their springshow, "That's Entertainment," in two performances May 5 at the Nampa Civic Center.

For more than 50 years this female vocal ensemble's performances have grown from strictly straight, stand-up concerts to shows with jazzy choreography and colorful costumes, a transition that has broadened their appeal to both performers and audiences.

"That's Entertainment" is no exception. It will feature guest performers in commercial spots for some of the Musettes' more generous supporters and will be narrated in a game show format featuring Rorque Wood and Katie Hassard, with Bob Brady as emcee.

The show kicks off with a rousing rendition of the theme song, "That's Entertainment," followed by some favorite music from the radio over the years such as "Lollipop," "Sincerely," and "New York, New York," performed by local soloist and thespian Gregg Irwin. The audience will

The final song in this section is a current country hit, "Stuck Like Glue," made famous by the band Sugarland. All these numbers and more feature the innovative choreography of Lisa Hendricks.

In addition to songs from the radio, and in keeping with the entertainment theme, the program will feature selections from TV, like the ending credits song from Lawrence Welk, from movies such as the theme from Pearl Harbor, and from Broadway shows both past and present, all of which promise to bring back some good memories.

Some selections will be performed by small groups and guest performers, ending with the ever-popular theme song from The Carol Burnett show, featuring past Musettes member Corla Legg.

The show will even have some beautiful selections from two operas. Crystal Christensen, the 2011 First Place Student Winner of the Margaret Goering Vocal Scholarship, a senior at Rocky Mountain High School, will sing Mozart's "Non so piu cosa son" from the opera "The Marriage of Figaro," and the audience will also be favored with Puccini's "Quando Men Vo" from the opera "La Boheme," performed by the 2011 first-place Musettes scholarship winner, Alyssa Hill, of Meridian. Crystal's vocal coach has been Deanna Pond of Meridian, and Alyssa is coached by Andy Maddox of Nampa.

The Musettes are led by director Lydia Brady with accompanist/president and producer JeNeale Gunnell. Kea Loveland, Janeil Plum and Bob Brady have worked as artistic directors on the commercials and production numbers.

great-grandchildren.



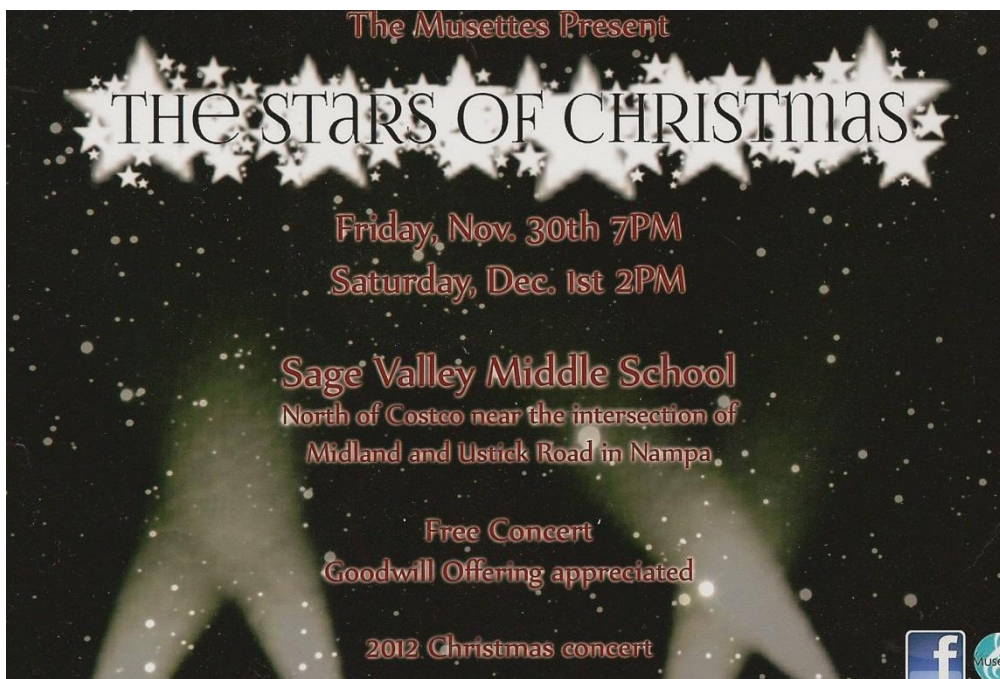

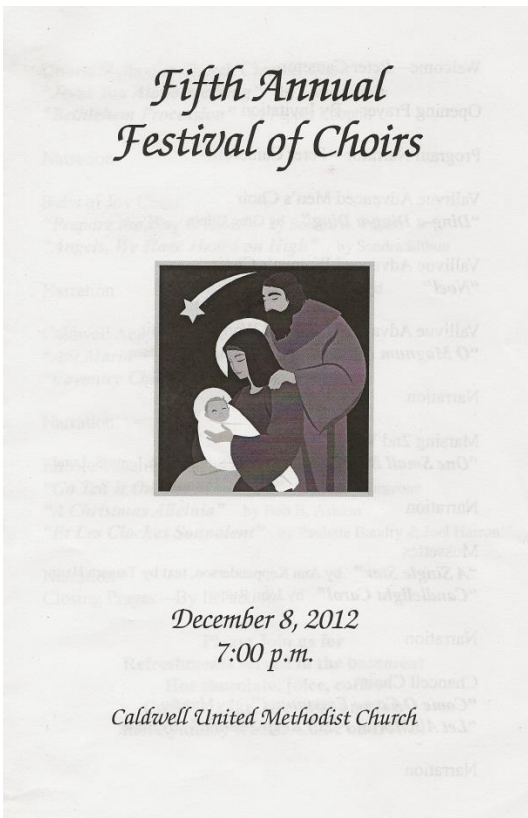
